“Proper handling of contamination in cotton”

3. How do the impurities affect the price of cotton?
4. What are the requirements of the different steps of the textile industry?
5. What cleaning options are there in spinning and what are their advantages and disadvantages?
6. What are the possibilities for systematically controlling contaminations along the various process steps in the spinning mill?
7. What new machine tools are there for processing contaminated cotton and maintaining spinning stability?
8. How do you deal economically with contaminations?
